
With the 2020 Lincoln Aviator, navigating traffic feels a little more effortless thanks to the Lincoln Co-Pilot360[™] technology. It uses adaptive cruise control to adjust to the pace of nearby cars and keeps a preset distance from the vehicle ahead. Its stop and go functionality automatically brings the vehicle to a complete stop and restarts acceleration when traffic begins to move. The Aviator's Evasive Steering Assist uses cameras and sensors to detect if a frontal collision is imminent and can both brake for you and help you steer around obstacles. Drivers can feel more confident backing up knowing that Reverse Brake Assist will apply the brakes if it detects an obstacle behind the vehicle. Lastly, with the help of Active Park Assist Plus, parallel parking is as easy as pressing a button.

When it comes to design, this smooth and luxurious vehicle uses intentional horizontal lines and a sloping roof to create a sense of power and motion. The Lincoln signature grille on the Aviator Reserve is a field of repeating chrome Lincoln logo-like shapes with a Lincoln Star logo in the centre. The grille on the Aviator Grand Touring has the Star logo surrounded by raised and repeated Star logo shapes.

You will find the space saving gear shift push buttons positioned below the centre dash vents taking the place of an actual gear shift lever. Also, instead of door levers, the Aviator uses buttons located on the door handles' backside to open their powered doors. As an added bonus, replacing the usual hard warning chimes for an open door or unbuckled seat belt are soothing musical notes recorded by the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

When you are nearby, your 2020 Lincoln Aviator knows. Using either the key fob or your smartphone, activated with Phone As A Key through the Lincoln Way app and Lincoln Connect subscription, the Aviator responds to you in several ways with approach detection. The side mirrors project a signature Lincoln logo welcome mat on the ground below the door. Models with the available Air Glide Suspension with Dynamic Lower Entry will lower to just over five centimetres (two inches) to make getting in the vehicle easier. Headlamps and taillamps gradually reach full illumination. The Adaptive Pixel LED Headlamps are designed to shine light further into the distance at highway speeds and the light array widens to help drivers detect potential hazards at lower speeds. Using camera technology, it pre-illuminates the direction the road is heading by reading road signs and lane markings.

Absolute comfort is a high priority for this luxurious vehicle. The spacious interior decor combines a plush organic tan leather and metallic trim for an indulgent yet simple look. The driver and front passenger can customize their seating with the available 30 Way Perfect Position front seats with thigh extenders. The seats are heated, ventilated, adjustable in 30 different ways and include five different types of Active Motion massaging. As for the second row, its configurations can accommodate up to seven with a second row bench seat, or it can play host to two captain's chairs. The PowerFold[™] third row can comfortably seat two passengers or be quickly folded flat with the press of a button for added cargo room.

Lincoln knows that sometimes people can feel overwhelmed by having too many options before them. To create a more calming environment, functions such as cruise control disappear on the steering wheel until you press a button. As an alternative to staring at the various information, entertainment, climate controls and navigation data on the dash screens and instrument panel, the 2020 Lincoln Aviator has a new calm screen feature. 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

FRONTLINE FAMILY SOLIDARITY AND SUPPORT HELP LOCAL HEALTHCARE WORKERS IN THE FIGHT AGAINST COVID-19

As countries around the world grappled with a deluge of novel Coronavirus cases in early 2020, hospitals across Canada began preparing for the worst.

By early spring, local healthcare workers had already logged countless hours planning for the inevitable surge in hospital admissions; securing adequate PPE and creating new treatment protocols and safety procedures virtually overnight.

"I think it really speaks to the teamwork that we have at Windsor Regional to see how we came together to organize ourselves," says Dr. Natalie Malus, Medical Director of the ICU at Windsor Regional Hospital. "It was an amazing response from everyone; from administrators and healthcare workers to frontline staff, clerks, and environmental services."

That unity has continued at the COVID-19 Assessment Centre. From proper donning and doffing of PPE to rigorous cleaning procedures, the entire team has worked together from day one to ensure the safety of patients and staff.



Despite preparations and precautions, fear of the unknown was still top of mind for those on the frontline in the early days of the pandemic.

"There was a lot of anxiety in the first month or so, because we really didn't know what we were dealing with," reflects Nurse Brad Stooke. "The main worry was for the community and our friends and families."

Stooke is a nurse on the Clinical Teaching Unit floor of Windsor Regional Hospital's Ouellette campus, which became the official unit for non-ICU COVID-19 patients. Although the pressure of dealing with an all-new virus has been intense at times, Stooke notes that the ongoing support of administration and colleagues has helped maintain a calm atmosphere.

"Every day we receive an email update from top management; telling us what to expect, what to prepare for," says Stooke. "It's very reassuring."

Teamwork, Leadership & Strategic Planning

Daily e-mail updates, conference calls, and virtual meetings are instrumental in keeping everyone on the same page, echoes Dr. Eli Malus, Critical Care LHIN Lead for Windsor, Leamington, Chatham and Sarnia.

As a Critical Care Fellow in Toronto during the SARS outbreak of 2003, Malus saw firsthand how one virus could bring an entire healthcare system to a halt. From that scare, Critical Care Services Ontario overhauled their entire critical care system; implementing new strategies for data sharing, treatment, and more.

"We learned a lot from SARS," says Malus. "Because of that, when we started having our first cases (of COVID-19) in March, we were actually ready."

Malus credits the dedication of Windsor Regional Hospital CEO David Musyj, VP Karen Riddell, and his colleagues across the province with creating a cohesive response. From Windsor to Sarnia and beyond, all protocols are the same across the board.

"We have every ICU doing the same thing," explains Malus. "When you have a team approach, you're a much stronger group."

Cleaning & Comforting

Sanitizing efforts have also been a key component in helping reassure both patients and staff.

"It helps them relax a little when they see all the cleaning that's being done around them," adds Piche. "All the chairs, railings, the desks; everything is constantly being cleaned. Bathrooms are scrubbed, including the walls, after each use."

Comforting visitors has also become a welcome part of the job.

"The patients obviously have some nervousness," says Piche. "When they come in to the clinic, we try to keep them as calm as possible. That's not something we (housekeeping) normally did pre-COVID, but it makes them feel good."

Community Support

An outpouring of support has allowed the team to concentrate on the momentous task at hand.

"We have seen so much support. Not just from management, but from our coworkers and the community; it has really eased our anxieties and helped us focus on the patients and what they are going through," says Stooke.

"There's been a lot of community support; donations of personal protective equipment (PPE), and medical equipment." Everybody has been pitching in," adds Dr. Natalie Malus.

Looking Ahead

While the healthcare team is confident in their current strategies, protocols will continue to evolve as more new information becomes available. They also acknowledge that the trajectory of the next few months also very much depends on keeping community spread in check.

"We know it's still out there; it will be with us for a while," says Dr. Natalie Malus. "People still need to wear masks, social distance, wash their hands. Those are the things that really help."

"Any system could easily become overwhelmed," adds Dr. Eli Malus. "We'll have to take it day by day and be ready to adapt. Everybody has to row in the same direction."

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

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
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Home Sweet (Urban) Home how a few key updates can breathe new life into any space

When tackling any size project, Urbanhome utilizes several different design applications to create the final product, including 3D renderings of the rooms, as well as design boards.





With Easy Price now successfully implemented, Ledingham has his sights set on the next project: an allnew performance vehicle specialty store, located right on the same property.



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SHOULD I CONTRIBUTE TO AN RRSP, A TFSA, OR BOTH?

The introduction of the Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA) in 2009 represented the most important change to the way Canadians save money since Registered Retirement Savings Plans (RRSPs) were launched in the 1950s. Now, the question today is: Should you contribute to a TFSA, an RRSP, or both?

- When choosing between an RRSP or TFSA, you need to understand your personal financial situation and your shortand long-term goals.
- Consider RRSPs for long-term investments and if you expect to be in a lower tax bracket after retirement.
- TFSAs may be a better option for short-term goals and can be more tax-efficient if your pre-retirement tax rate is no more than your retirement tax rate

Both RRSPs and TFSAs provide investors with the opportunity for tax-effective investment growth. But unlike an RRSP, contributions to a TFSA are not tax-deductible, amounts can be withdrawn tax-free at any time, and withdrawn amounts are added back into your TFSA contribution room the following year.

Which is best?

On a very basic level, looking at your pre-retirement and expected post-retirement marginal tax rates can help you determine how to best allocate your investments. If you expect to be in a lower tax bracket during retirement, contributing to an RRSP is generally more beneficial. However, if you expect your retirement tax bracket to be equal or higher than your pre-retirement tax rate, the TFSA may be more tax-efficient for you.

Hold on; not so fast.

If only things were that simple! There are a few more factors you should consider. Even if you anticipate having a lower marginal tax rate in retirement, maximizing your RRSP contributions may not always be the most tax-efficient long-term strategy. Since RRSP withdrawals (directly or through your registered retirement income fund (RRIF) or an annuity) increase your taxable income, those withdrawals may affect certain government income-tested benefits and credits such as the Old Age Security benefit and the age credit. On the other hand, if your expected marginal tax rate in retirement is equal to or higher than during your accumulation years, contributing to your TFSA is not always the best approach. For example, RRSPs that are converted to a RRIF or an annuity after age 65 can produce income that is eligible for the pension income tax credit, thus qualifying for pension incomesplitting with your spouse. Other incomesplitting strategies such as spousal RRSPs could distribute a portion of your taxable income to a spouse with a lower marginal tax rate in retirement, further reducing your tax bill and reducing the claw-back effect on your income-tested benefits and credits.



So where does this leave us?

An RRSP is definitely a long-term investment vehicle. The taxes and lost contribution room associated with early withdrawals are strong incentives to keep your money invested until retirement. A TFSA, generally speaking, may be better suited for shorter-term goals, such as an emergency fund or saving for a major purchase, since you pay no tax on withdrawals, and withdrawn amounts are added back into your TFSA contribution room the following year. Although a TFSA can also be a retirement savings tool, because you can easily withdraw those savings (no taxes on withdrawals or loss of contribution room), you must resist the temptation to dip into it prior to retirement to fully benefit from its potential as a source of retirement income. Remember, there is no one-size-fits-all solution. Your personal savings strategy needs to take into account your unique circumstances as well as your short- and long-term objectives. 

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One of the most frequently asked questions relates to the use of company owned automobiles. Although, the tax provisions concerning this may appear complex, they are not difficult to understand and are discussed below:

Standby charge

If your employer provides you with a company owned automobile for business and personal use, a taxable benefit will be added to your income and will generally be reported on your T4 slip at the end of the year. This is normally referred to as a standby charge and is calculated at 2% per month (24% per year) of the original cost of the automobile for each month that the automobile is made available for your use. If the automobile is leased, then the standby charge is calculated at two-thirds of the lease payments. Furthermore, HST (13% in Ontario) would also be added to the benefit calculation.

The standby charge can be reduced if the following two conditions are met:

• Your personal use of the automobile does not exceed 20,000 kilometres per year.

• Your business use of the automobile is at least 50 percent or more of the total kilometres driven in the year.

For example, let's say that your company owns the automobile that had a cost of \$40,000 and you drove 40,000 km in the year. Of this amount, 24,000 (60%) was for business and 16,000 km (40%) was for personal use. Ordinarily, the standby charge would be \$9600 (\$40,000 x 2% x 12 months). However, because your business use was greater than 50 percent, the standby charge would be reduced to \$7680 (\$9600 x [16,000 km/20,000 km]). A word of caution: you should be aware that for the purposes of this calculation, driving between home and your employer's place of business is considered personal use.

Operating cost benefit

If the company pays for all the operating costs of the automobile, for example, gas, insurance, maintenance, etc., a benefit will, again, be added to your T4. This taxable benefit is calculated at 28 cents for the number of personal kilometers driven in the year (25 cents per kilometer if you are in the business of selling or leasing automobiles).

If your business use of automobile is greater than 50 percent, there is an alternative calculation that you may find beneficial. It is based on 50 percent of the standby charge otherwise calculated. If you prefer this option then you must inform your employer in writing before December 31st, to have the taxable benefit determined on this basis.

You can avoid this taxable benefit if you reimburse your employer for the operating costs by February 14th of the following year.

Planning opportunities

• Since the standby charge calculation is based on the original cost of the automobile, and does not take in to account the fact that the value of the car depreciates every year, it may be cheaper to eliminate this benefit by acquiring the automobile at its fair market value after, say, two to three years at a much-reduced price. You can then consider charging back your employer for business use of your personal automobile and receive a reasonable reimbursement on a per-kilometre basis.

• Reduce the amount of time your company automobile is available for personal use. For instance, if you happen to be away on vacation with the family or on an extended business trip, consider leaving the automobile on business premises during those times.



Assuming, that the automobile was only available to you for 315 days instead of 365, your standby charge will be reduced to 10 instead of 12 months because the calculation is based on, first, the number of days during which the automobile is available during the year and, second, this number is divided by 30 and rounded to the nearest whole number, and further rounded down if it is exactly in the middle (315/30 = 10.5 months, rounded to 10 months).

• If your personal kilometres are reasonably low, consider calculating the operating expense taxable benefit using the 28 cents per personal kilometre method as opposed to using the 50 percent of the standby charge. This involves a bit of record keeping as you must maintain a record of business and personal kilometres driven but, it is worth the tax savings.

• Request your employer to consider the option that results in a lower taxable benefit for the standby charge under, both, purchase and lease option. It is a worth while exercise that may reduce overall tax cost.

As always, consult your tax advisor for circumstances that are unique to your fact situation.

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


