

HOW WINDSOR'S SIGNATURE FESTIVAL BRINGS CULTURES TOGETHER AND STRENGTHENS COMMUNITY BONDS

Throughout history, Windsor has been a welcoming city for those seeking a new life, fleeing conflicts, and uncertainty. Refugees and immigrants from various parts of the world have found shelter and the opportunity here to rebuild their dreams. It is this richness of cultures, stories, and traditions that the Carrousel of the Nations has been celebrating for 50 years, transforming Windsor-Essex into a true mosaic of identity and belonging.

The festival, which takes place every June, brings together over 35 villages representing various nationalities through food, music, dance, and traditions. "The Carrousel of the Nations allows people from so many backgrounds to highlight their heritage and history. Over the past 50 years, it has grown, and now it is a staple of the summer!" said Fred Francis, Executive Director of the Multicultural Council of Windsor and Essex County (MCC), the organization behind the award winning event.









In 2025, the Carrousel of the Nations will take place on the following weekends: June 13, 14, 15, and June 20, 21, 22. The confirmed villages are Polish, Slovak, German, Italian, Greek, and Hungarian, with many more to explore. Each one opens its doors, inviting all to visit and share their cuisine, entertainment, and cultural heritage, free of charge.

"Everybody gets to enjoy those many different aspects of those different cultures without leaving their city or country," Francis added. He also believes the celebration promotes inclusion and helps combat racism and discrimination by providing authentic and immersive experiences. In the past two years, the event has won Attractions Ontario's Best Festival Award.

The Villages

The Polish village, which has been part of Carrousel of the Nations since its inception, is already confirmed. While traditional dishes like pierogies and sausages are always a hit, its spectacular dance performances are the main attraction. To Maria Kulesza, Vice president of the organizing committee and director of the Tatry Song and Dance Ensemble, the gathering is more than just a celebration—it is a connection to her Polish roots, especially for those like herself, who immigrated and had to start anew in a new country. "When I immigrated to Canada, having an event like this made me feel like I still had a connection to being back home. Carrousel of the Nations gave us an opportunity to connect and form new friendships."

Seeing younger generations singing and dancing reassures her

that the Polish heritage remains strong. What Maria values most about Polish heritage is its hospitality. "Polish people are a very hospitable group. We love nothing more than to host others and show them a good time. We love to sing and dance and share our love of this with others as well. Even if you are not Polish, we like to treat you like you are one of our own."

Germany will also be represented by the Teutonia Club, which has been involved with the festival since the very beginning. According to the club president, Nick Tonita, the village is the perfect blend of food and dance, drawing visitors across the county. While authentic cuisine and drinks are always a highlight, what stands out most to Nick are the friendships he has built over the years, strengthening the bonds among the German residents. "The Carrousel of the Nations allows many cultures to be displayed and is a staple for Windsor. New immigrants can get a taste of the city's share of inclusion and diversity by attending as many villages as possible," he said.

Greek culture and traditions are also prominently featured throughout the festival's two weekends. In addition to the famous loukoumades, or honey balls—fried dough drizzled and topped with sugar or cinnamon—the space will also feature performances. According to Thomas Papantonis, the President of the Greek Orthodox Community of Windsor, one of the most essential characteristics of the community is the concept of philotimo, a philosophy embraced by the Greek people that embodies empathy, compassion, and generosity. "It really describes our way of life, and there is no real way to explain or describe it. It simply has to be lived and experienced," he summarizes.

To participate as an exhibitor, one must be a member in good standing with the MCC and reflect its mission to create a welcoming community for all through education, community engagment, and the promotion of diversity and equality. The operation of the many different villages largely depends on the ongoing commitment of volunteers who contribute year after year by preparing food, coordinating performances, and setting up exhibits representing their countries of origin.

While the villages bring history to life, the festival would not have been possible without the institution's work, which has been organizing the celebration for five decades. The MCC supports newcomers and refugees with housing, English learning, job training, social integration, and even medical assistance through an on-site clinic. "We assist people in everything anyone can imagine with resettling in a new country," Francis summarized and added: "Sometimes it is not just about employment skills. Sometimes it is the need to meet people and go to a social setting to establish friendships so that you do not feel so isolated and alone. We do all of that."

The organization has been a community Institution, for over fifity years. In addition to its many services, the MCC hosts an annual Awards Gala, which honors those who contribute to making the community a more welcoming place for all. In 2012, Rafih Auto Group Chairman and CEO, Terry Rafih, was honoured as the MCC Champion Award recipient.

The rise in immigration reflects the search for stability, freedom, and prosperity in Canada. "People want to come to Canada for several reasons: it is stable, free, and prosperous. It allows you to raise your kids in an environment where they can be educated, get a good job, and live a good life," Francis explained.

He says promoting events like the Carrousel of the Nations ensures greater inclusion and is the key element to fighting racism. "When we show people that they can experience different cultures directly, talk to people from those cultures, and learn from them first-hand, it eliminates ignorance. And when we eliminate ignorance, we eliminate racism, bigotry, and discrimination," he concluded.

For decades, Mercedes-Benz has defined excellence for automotive luxury. Now, with the 2025 EQS Sedan, the brand blends tradition with cutting-edge electric technology, delivering a vehicle that captivates with its sleek design while enhancing both performance and efficiency. The model arrives with significant upgrades, such as a 118 kWh battery, which increases its driving range, a new regenerative braking system, and a series of

adjustments that ensure an even more comfortable ride. One of the many highlights is the MBUX Hyperscreen, which integrates three screens into one continuous panel and offers intuitive, modern interaction. This is ideal for those needing a sophisticated, technological vehicle for everyday use.

The exterior design of the new model brings sophisticated updates that reinforce its identity of luxury and innovation. The 2025 EQS maintains the fluid and futuristic silhouette characteristic of Mercedes-Benz electric models, but now has refined details that make its presence on the streets even more striking. The front grille has been redesigned and now features a deep black panel integrated with the headlights, creating a more fluid and modern appearance. Also, new embedded chrome slats have been added. The traditional "three-pointed star" is now positioned vertically on the hood, reinforcing the premium identity of the model.



The car's sporty AMG Line bumper is standard, ensuring a more dynamic look. Furthermore, its aerodynamics are optimized: the body design maintains one of the lowest drag coefficients in the world (Cd 0.20), improving energy and road capability. The model also offers new wheel options and finishes.

The new 118 kWh battery provides an even greater range for the electric vehicle and powers all of its powertrain, which is based on permanent magnet synchronous electric motors. Additionally, it features technologies such as regenerative braking and a heat pump to optimize energy and increase range. Using residual heat from the electric components and the high-voltage battery to heat the interior minimizes the need to draw power for climate control, thus extending the vehicle's electric range.

The 2025 Mercedes-Benz EQS 580 4MATIC system can accelerate from 0 to 100 km/h in just 4.4 seconds.

The rapid acceleration is due to the 580 4MATIC version's dual electric motor, which provides an instant torque response, an advantage of electric vehicles over combustion-powered ones.

The 4MATIC® system is Mercedes-Benz's all-wheel drive, which automatically distributes engine power to all four wheels as needed. This technique ensures better grip and stability, especially in corners and wet or snowy roads. It also allows for better acceleration and responsiveness, as the car intelligently distributes force between the axles.

The EQS 580 4MATIC uses two electric motors, one on each axle (front and rear), delivering a balanced and powerful drive in any condition. The car also features the Disconnect Unit (DCU), which automatically disconnects the front motor when driving under low power demand conditions. This technology ensures that all-wheel drive is only engaged when necessary.







Tucked away on a quiet street in Ontario's southernmost town, its humble brick exterior belies the richness of its contents. Step through its doors, however, and you enter a portal to over 150 years of military and local history—a treasure trove of artifacts, documents, uniforms, and personal stories that chronicle the experiences of Kingsville and Essex County residents who served their country with pride.

Founded by a group of passionate volunteers, the museum began with a simple mission: To preserve the memories and mementos of those who served. Today, it stands as a dynamic, ever-growing institution, run entirely by volunteers, that welcomes school groups, veterans, and curious visitors alike. What sets the Kingsville Military Museum apart is not just the impressive collection it houses, but the heart behind it. Every item, every display, every letter or medal tells a human story—a local story.



To support this mission, the museum has launched a fundraising campaign where donors are recognized with military-inspired titles:

- General \$100,000+
- Colonel \$50,000+
- Captain \$25,000+
- Corporal \$10,000+

Each rank represents not just a donation, but a commitment to preserving the legacy of our heroes.

The museum's exhibits span from the earliest military engagements in Canadian history to the modern-day peacekeeping missions that define Canada's role on the global stage. But what makes this museum truly unique is its ability to localize these global events, showing how the great wars of history impacted families right here in Kingsville.



DISPLAYS

Long before Canada became a confederation, young men from Kingsville answered the call to defend their communities during the Fenian Raids of the 1860s.

One of the lesser-known chapters in Canada's military history is brought to life through letters, photographs, and uniforms from the Boer War (1899-1902), when Canadian soldiers traveled to South Africa. The museum presents stories of bravery from Essex County men who served overseas long before the Great Wars. Those brave soldiers who returned from the Boer War were presented with a glass cane, made in the Glass Factory on Lansdowne Avenue from 1899-1904. Four of these canes are on display.

The "war to end all wars" changed the world and left an indelible mark on Kingsville. The museum holds letters from the trenches, rusted helmets, and trench art made from shell casings. Meanwhile, World War II saw many more of Kingsville's sons and daughters enter the fight. The museum showcases uniforms from RCAF pilots, naval uniforms, and gear used by infantrymen in Europe.

Visitors from across Ontario and beyond come to see what lies within its walls. Teachers bring students here to witness history beyond the pages of a textbook. Veterans return to find pieces of their past. And through it all, volunteers keep the doors open, the artifacts preserved, and the memories alive.

The museum also highlights Canada's post-WWII contributions to global peacekeeping efforts. Blue helmets, UN service medals, and gear from Afghanistan missions offer visitors a look at the evolving role of Canadian Forces. The Kingsville Military Museum looks forward to having artifacts from Vietnam and Cold War in the new extension.

Dozens of military uniforms are displayed throughout the museum, many of them donated by local families. These include a WWII RCAF bomber jacket worn by a pilot shot down over Germany, a Korean War Army dress uniform adorned with medals, and a UN Peacekeeping uniform stained from fieldwork in Cyprus.

Every display in the Kingsville Military Museum is a window into the past. The stories they tell are personal, powerful, and profoundly human.

Every artifact on display holds a piece of history—a connection to the people who lived, fought, and sacrificed for their country. From rare wartime relics to personal letters home, these items bring history to life in a way no textbook ever could.

Among the most treasured displays in the museum is the collection of service medals awarded to local heroes. The museum also houses an extensive collection of handwritten letters, postcards, and journals that provide a deeply personal glimpse into wartime life.

Kingsville holds a proud distinction: more men per capita from this small town served in World War II than from any other community in Essex County. It's a powerful reminder of the town's strong sense of duty, patriotism, and community spirit. But behind that statistic are real people, with real stories—many of whom are honoured at the Kingsville Military Museum.

Flight Officer Kenneth Jacobs



Kingsville born land owner, Private James Aaron Jacobs served in WW1 with 4th Battalion Canadian Infantry. His son, Flight Officer Kenneth Jacobs, served WW2 with Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps and Royal Canadian Air Force. F/O Kenneth Jacobs was the first Black Canadian career flying officer promoted to Lieutenant Colonel in April 1975. He was also the

first Black social worker at the Toronto Children's Aid Society. At the museum a display board documents his family's achievements in the military as well as in the community. A family headstone is in the Black Cemetery in Kingsville.

Then there's Colonel Frederick Jasperson, who was captured and became a Prisoner of War at Dieppe. Despite the harsh conditions, he held onto hope. One of the most touching artifacts in the museum is his old leather baseball glove—used in games with other prisoners to keep their spirits up. That glove is now on display, symbolizing strength, resilience, and the human will to survive. His glove is on display in the main lobby

The museum also shares the story of Mary and Gwen Lucas, two sisters who joined the Royal Canadian Air Force, Women's Division. They served in important roles that helped keep operations running during the war. Photographs and military information about their military family is on a display board as well as in the research binders in the library.

The Military Lucas Family consisted of the father, Edward enlisting in WW1 Army & WW2 Essex Scottish Regiment. the call. The museum keeps their memories alive through artifacts, personal letters, and uniforms—making sure their bravery is never forgotten.

The Kingsville Military Museum is a hidden gem in our community, preserving not just military history but the broader story of Kingsville itself. 
The vision for the museum's next chapter includes:

The museum includes displays on women in the workforce, local Red Cross efforts, and the transformation of industry during wartime.

Visitors will find ration cards, tin Victory Garden signs, and even a child's gas mask. One exhibit chronicles the war brides who came to Kingsville after WWII, bringing with them new cultures and traditions. Another display pays tribute to the Native veterans from Essex County who served with distinction, often without recognition.

It is these details that make the museum not only a site of remembrance but also a place of discovery. It tells not just Canada's story, but Kingsville's story—layer by layer, artifact by artifact.





From Turquoise Waters to Timeless Traditions, Discover the Magic of Japan's Southern Gem By Paula Just

Meanwhile, thrill-seekers can venture off Hateruma Island or Yonaguni to dive alongside hammerhead sharks during migration season.

Okinawa has a distinct cultural identity, shaped by influences from China and Southeast Asia and its own independent history as the Ryukyu Kingdom. It boasts colorful festivals, lively folk music, and unique architectural styles that reflect its past.

The local way of life is also different. Okinawans are known for their relaxed and positive mindset, often summarized by the phrase "nankuru nai sa," which

loosely translates to "everything will work out." This philosophy is deeply embedded in the region's lifestyle and is believed to contribute to Okinawa's impressive longevity rates.

Okinawans are known for having one of the highest life expectancies in the world, and much of this is attributed to their nutritious and balanced diet. Traditional dishes are rich in vegetables, seafood, and lean proteins, with minimal processed ingredients.

A must-try dish is Goya Champuru, a stir-fry made with bitter melon (goya), tofu, egg, and pork. While its slightly bitter taste may be an acquired preference, locals swear by its health benefits. Another staple is Soki Soba, a hearty noodle soup topped with slow-cooked pork ribs braised with awamori (Okinawa's signature liquor), soy sauce, and sugar. Often referred to as the "ramen of the tropics," this dish is a favorite among locals and tourists.

Awamori is a must for those interested in trying an authentic Okinawan drink. This rice-based distilled liquor is aged in clay pots, which allows it to develop deeper flavors over time. It is typically served on the rocks or mixed with water but can also be enjoyed straight. Aged awamori that has matured for more than three years is known as kusu, and it is considered a luxury item, often gifted on special occasions.

Beyond its natural beauty and unique cuisine, Okinawa has a rich historical background. The region was the site of one of World War II's most devastating battles, and remnants of this period can be seen in places such as the Okinawa Peace Memorial Park and the Former Japanese Navy Underground Headquarters.



One of the most famous places is Shuri Castle, once the Ryukyu Kingdom's royal palace. This UNESCO World Heritage Site was originally built in the 13th century and served as the political and cultural center of the region. Though it has been reconstructed multiple times due to destruction—most recently after a devastating fire in 2019—the castle symbolizes Okinawa's enduring heritage. The restoration process is ongoing, with completion expected by 2026, allowing visitors to witness the rebuilding of this historic treasure firsthand.

Okinawa is easily accessible via flights from Tokyo and Osaka. While the general cost of travel in Okinawa is lower than in Tokyo, accommodations and car rentals can be more expensive during peak seasons, especially in the summer months. The ideal time to visit Okinawa is spring and autumn. These seasons offer pleasant weather while avoiding the typhoon season, which typically occurs from late summer to early fall.

Whether you're drawn to its pristine beaches, fascinating history, unique culture, or incredible cuisine, Okinawa is a destination that deserves a spot on everybody's list. So, if you're planning a trip to Japan, why not venture beyond the mainland and discover the magic of Okinawa?







BEYOND THE BOX

The introduction of the Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA) in 2009 represented the most important change to the way Canadians save money since Registered Retirement Savings Plans (RRSPs) were launched in the 1950s. Now, the question today is: Should you contribute to a TFSA, an RRSP, or both?

When choosing between an RRSP or TFSA, you need to understand your personal financial situation and your short- and long-term goals.

Both RRSPs and TFSAs provide investors with the opportunity for tax-efficient investment growth. But unlike an RRSP, contributions to a TFSA are not tax-deductible, amounts can be withdrawn tax-free at any time, and withdrawn amounts are added back into your TFSA contribution room the following year.

Which is best?

On a very basic level, looking at your pre-retirement and expected postretirement marginal tax rates can help you determine how to best allocate your investments. If you expect to be in a lower tax bracket during retirement, contributing to an RRSP is generally more beneficial. However, if you expect your retirement tax bracket to be equal or higher than your pre-retirement tax rate, the TFSA may be more tax-efficient for you.

Hold on; not so fast

If only things were that simple! There are a few more factors you should consider. Even if you anticipate having a lower marginal tax rate in retirement, maximizing your RRSP contributions may not always be the most tax-efficient long-term strategy. Since RRSP withdrawals (directly or through your registered retirement income fund (RRIF) or an annuity) increase your taxable income, those withdrawals may affect certain government income-tested benefits and credits such as the Old Age Security (OAS) pension and the age credit.

On the other hand, if your expected marginal tax rate in retirement is equal to or higher than during your accumulation years, contributing to your TFSA is not always the best approach. For example, RRSPs that are converted to a RRIF or an annuity after age 65 can produce income that is eligible for the pension income tax credit, thus qualifying for pension income-splitting with your spouse. Other income-splitting strategies such as spousal RRSPs could distribute a portion of your taxable income to a spouse with a lower marginal tax rate in retirement, further reducing your tax bill and reducing the claw-back effect on your income-tested benefits and credits.

So where does this leave us?

An RRSP is definitely a long-term investment vehicle. The taxes and lost contribution room associated with early withdrawals are strong incentives to keep your money invested until retirement. A TFSA, generally speaking, may be better suited for shorter-term goals, such as an emergency fund or saving for a major purchase, since you pay no tax on withdrawals, and withdrawn amounts are added back into your TFSA contribution room the following year. Although a TFSA can also be a retirement savings tool, because you can easily withdraw those savings (no taxes on withdrawals or loss of contribution room), you must resist the temptation to dip into it prior to retirement to fully benefit from its potential as a source of retirement income.





TAX TALK: PROPRIETORSHIP, PARTNERSHIP OR A CORPORATION

If you are contemplating starting a business, a fundamental issue you would need to consider would be, "what form of business structure is best for me"? Although there are a myriad of business structures, the ones that are most commonly used are: Proprietorship, Partnership, or a Corporation.

Proprietorship

Simply put, a proprietorship means you are in business for yourself. This is the easiest form of business structure, and the costs are nominal. You can literally start this type of business instantaneously. All you have to do is to register it (if you are using a trade name) with the Provincial Government at nominal cost and even this requirement is waived if you choose to do the business in your own name.

Since the business is essentially "you", all the profits or losses are reported on your personal tax return. As is the case with most businesses, in the early years, the expenses usually exceed revenues. This creates a tax

opportunity as the losses can be offset against income from any other source.

As a sole proprietor you are personally responsible for all the debts and obligations of your business. This means that all your personal assets are exposed to risk. This is usually the most significant drawback of this type of business structure.

If you are in a high-income tax bracket and if your business is profitable then you would likely pay more tax as a sole proprietor as opposed to, say, a corporate structure. This, again, is another significant reason why you would not consider a proprietorship.

Partnership

A partnership, essentially, is a group of proprietors carrying on business together with the intention of making a profit. It is easy to form, and the costs are minimal, similar to a proprietorship. Partners include their prorata share of profit or loss on their personal tax returns.

Essentially, all the advantages and drawbacks applicable to proprietorships are also applicable to partnerships. However, some of the advantages unique to a partnership structure are: combination of people with different talents, sharing of risks and ability to raise more capital for the business.

Some of the drawbacks unique to this structure are: potential for disagreement between the partners, disruption of the business upon the death, disability or retirement of a partner and potential exposure to risk caused by actions of a partner. It is, therefore, always a good idea to have a partnership agreement in place to minimize the impact of these drawbacks.

Corporation

A corporation is unique in that it is considered a separate "legal entity", apart and distinct from its owner. In fact, for tax purposes also, it is treated as a separate person than you, "the shareholder".

There are two distinct advantages for choosing this structure:

First, it offers liability protection. In other words, debts and obligations of the corporation are not considered your obligations and, therefore, the creditors of the business do not have a claim against your personal assets in case of business failure.

Second, a corporation, carrying on an active business, pays a much lower tax on the first \$500,000 of its taxable income (approximately 12.2%, for an Ontario corporation). This provides a very significant benefit, particularly in case where the shareholder's marginal tax rate is, say, 53.53%. In our example, on \$500,000 of taxable income, the tax difference would be \$207,000 which represents a significant tax deferral, if monies are left in the corporation. To the extent that you draw funds out of the corporation for personal use, the tax advantage is mitigated as you would pay tax on these withdrawals.

Another major advantage is the potential of taking advantage of lifetime capital gains exemption of \$1,250,000 if your business qualifies and you are able to negotiate the sale of shares of your business. This opportunity is only available within a corporate structure.

There are two major drawbacks to a corporate structure:

First, is the initial cost of setting up and yearly filing and maintenance costs. These could run a few thousand dollars, annually.

Second, and perhaps the most significant drawback, is the potential of losses being "trapped", within the corporation. Since the corporation is considered a separate entity for tax purposes, any losses that it sustains belong solely to it and, therefore, cannot be claimed by another person. This is a major disadvantage, particularly if the shareholder has significant personal income from other sources.

The final choice of a business structure should always include a diligent review of all factors applicable to the fact situation.


